# "OLD LACEY SCHOOL" **ON DEMOLITION LIST**

The North Thurston School District has given notice that they intend to demolish the OLD LACEY SCHOOL building. Their tentative schedule states "complete destruction by June 1994". David Steele, Superintendent of North Thuirston School District, and the Lacey City Council had this business on the agenda of their joint meeting on October 25, 1993.

At that public meeting both the Lacey Historical Society and the Lacey Historical Commission presented their ideas for preserving the history that is represented by the old building. Superintendent Steele promised to include Lacey's advocates for historical preservation in future discussions of the site.
