

~ Up Date Report ~

The "Gallagher Barn" structure is progressing quickly over the Lacey water treatment well #7 plant on Lacey Street. Its "working barn" appearance disguises the treatment facility and enhances the two historic Lacey farmhouses located nearby:

the circa 1928 Russell house which is now the Lacey Museum, and the circa 1897 Gallagher House. Historically speaking, the "Gallagher Barn" placement in the

The gray and white trimmed "Gallagher Barn" completion date is expected in early June, 2002.

The "*Bell Sound*" project, spearheaded by the Lacey Historical Society is a task force partnership with The Lamplighter and Midday Lions clubs established in July, 2001.

The task force purpose is to:

- 1 Raise money needed to install a computer system to "ring out" the 1913 Lacey School bell sound from the Safeway Foods bell tower located on the site of the 1892 school.
- 2 Create a Memorial Plaza at the corner of Pacific Avenue and Carpentar recognizing the boys and girls of the Old Lacey School who were called "Lacey Lions" from 1892 1967.
