
Society's Annual Meeting - Five more early Lacey Pioneer Families are joining the "Oregon Train" traveling to the Washington Territory in the 1850's. they will be recognized at the Society's Annual Meeting.

Fifty citizens present at the 2004 Annual Meeting joined one of the pioneer family tables (John and Lydia Hawks, Urban Hicks, Tyrus and Emeline Himes, Stephen Ruddell and Chamber Brothers). Attendees were instructed on what to expect on their six-month journey west by:

- Wagon Master **Dave Welsh**, past-president of the Oregon California Trails Association.
- Weldon Rau, author of *Pioneering the Washington Territory*, the saga of his great grand parents, Willis and Mary Ann Boatman on their 1852 Oregon Trail Journey.
- Chuck Hornbuckle, author of *Cowlitz Trail*, an Auto Tour Guide.

The 2005 Annual Meeting includes a 15-minute documentary on *The Naches Trail* and viewing an update of the TCTV production of the *Cowlitz Trail* video.

The Annual Meeting Committee, Paul Henderson, Zelma Bernd and Emeline Ruddell Kilber are researching the next five settler families to be recognized. Their names will be announced in the August newsletter.



President's Report:

Our 125 plants/trees were inspected by Neil Wolbert of *Wolbert's Inc. Landscape Health Care*. His advice will result in the installation of additional drip irrigation, fertilizer and replacement of six dead flowering cherry trees. Mr. Wolbert generously offered to include our memorial plantings in his Spring insect spraying program.

Ken Marmion of *Mr. Fix-it* was awarded a contract to provide the services necessary to insure the Memorial Plants maintain healthy growth during summer, 2005. When we began the Memorial Plantings in 1986, nineteen years ago, our costs were minimal. Today, we are now facing major financial responsibilities to maintain the plantings.

Gallagher House preservation remains a principle Society purpose. The inset photo shows the new roof and painting that was recently completed. Electrical renovation is under way at newsletter preparation time. The house remains rented (same renter since 1994) providing security for the Gallagher House, the Lacey Museum and Lacey Women's Club. These three buildings are amongst the 125 Memorial Plants and truly can be called the heart of historical Lacey.
