Before Halloween 2006, the best sections of this historic cabin had been saved and

preserved by the City of Lacey. The cabin was taken apart piece by piece with each piece identified and tagged. Sixteen foot logs were treated and all items securely stored. 



Lacey Turned 40 Years Old!

The City of Lacey celebrated 40 years on November 30, 2006 with a grand party! Lacey City Council members, past and present, Lacey citizens and civic leaders enjoyed an evening of toasts and memories.

Issac Wood's descendent, Margaret Wood, gave a spirited insight into Lacey's Donation Land Claim owner of 1851. Rex Jordan, Lacey's first fire chief and leader for incorporation sent a fact letter detailing Lacey's early years that many in the audience remembered. Ken Ahlf, city attorney for 40 years, spoke about early growth problems. The Lacey Historical Society presented the city with two Memorial Albums honoring 125 citizens who have been recognized by plantings on Lacey Museum and Historical Society grounds. Mayor Virgil Clarkson invited everyone to attend Lacey's 50th anniversary party in 2016.
