"1891" "Lacey Train" to L.H.S. Annual Meeting

Do you know the three important events that took place in 1891 which greatly impacted the Woodland Community? Join us for this journey into the (hi) story that tells what has happened *AFTER* the arrival of our earlier 1800's pioneers

One passenger on board will be Isaac Ellis (Sue Goff) who will describe his interests in the opening of the Lacey Hotel and the new Woodland Driving Park. The John Adams' family spokesman will be George Carpenter (Lanny Weaver) who became Lacey's first Postmaster. He will explain "how" the new name happened. Our conductor (Amber Raney, Lacey's Curator) representing the Northern Pacific Railroad will inform us of the importance that this Lacey Depot had in the lives of the citizens of Woodland in 1891. She will also present the 2016 Lacey Depot project and its "All Aboard" importance today to the citizens of Lacey. Would you believe WHEN these three events took place?

- April 1891 N.P.R.R. builds Lacey Depot
- May 1891 Lacey Hotel and the Race Track open
- June 1891 Lacey Post Office is established

Upon returning to the Lacey Depot, the LHS will hold their annual election of officers and Trustees..


able for family genealogy research. The State Archives, State Library, local heritage organizations and volunteer genealogists combined to put on a great program.
